In this book, I'm going to talk about why Adolf Hitler forced the Jewish people to begin, let's retrace the history before World War II.

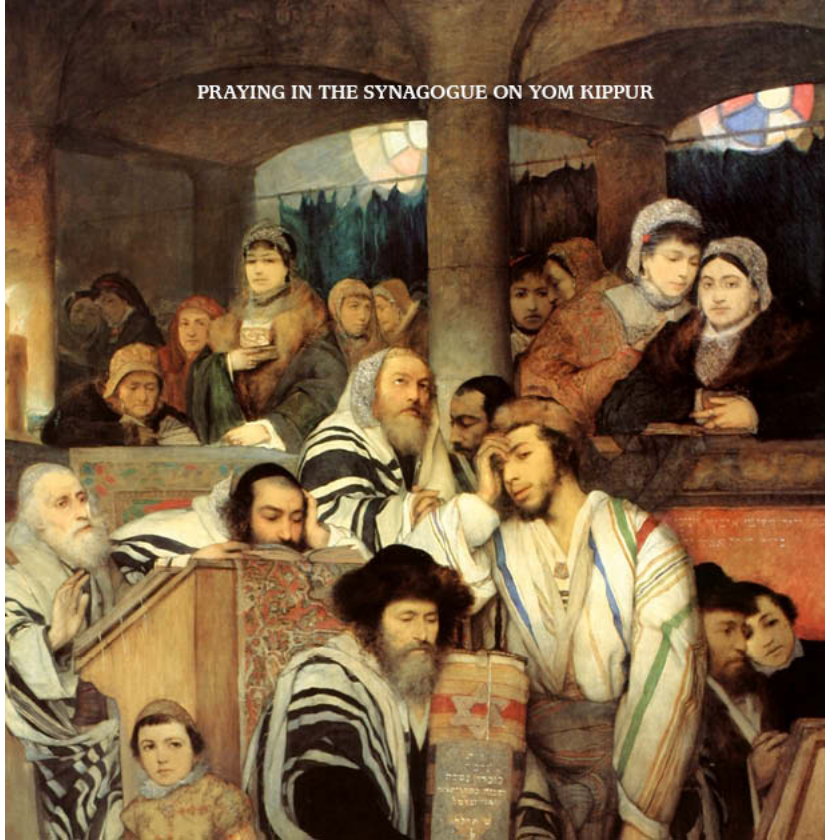


WHAT IS ANTI-SEMITISM?

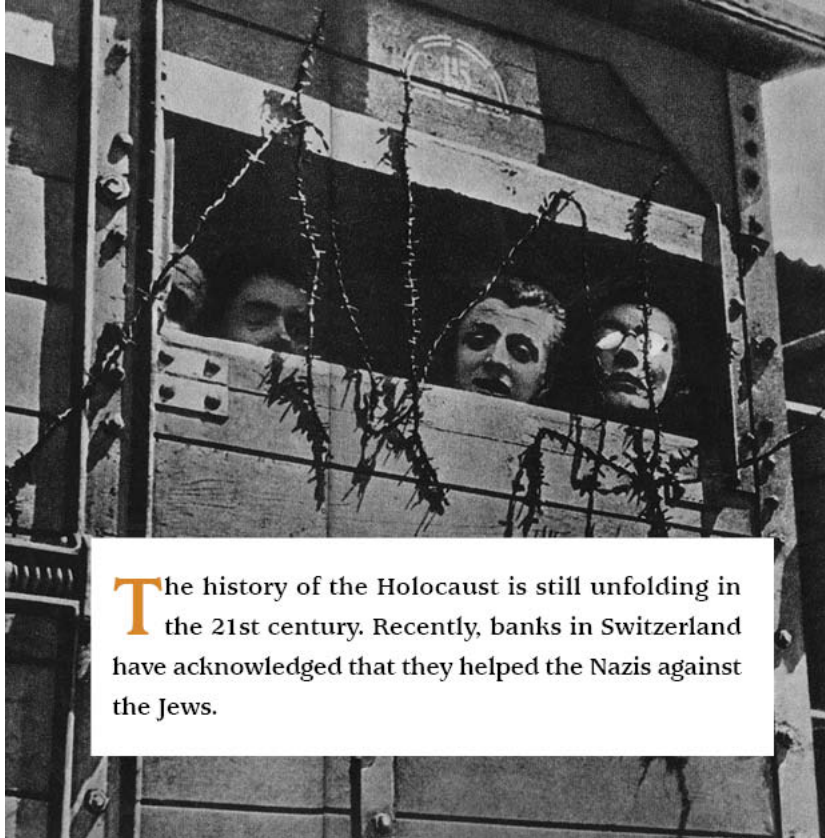
Anti-Semitism means hostility or prejudice toward Jewish people. Before Adolf Hitler rose to power in Germany, there was already anti-Semitism in Europe. The term “anti-Semitism” dates back to the 1870s, however, even in ancient times there was a great deal of hostility toward the Jewish people. They were banished from their homeland many times by governments such as the Roman Empire, which destroyed their Second Temple in 70 AD, forty years after the death of Christ.

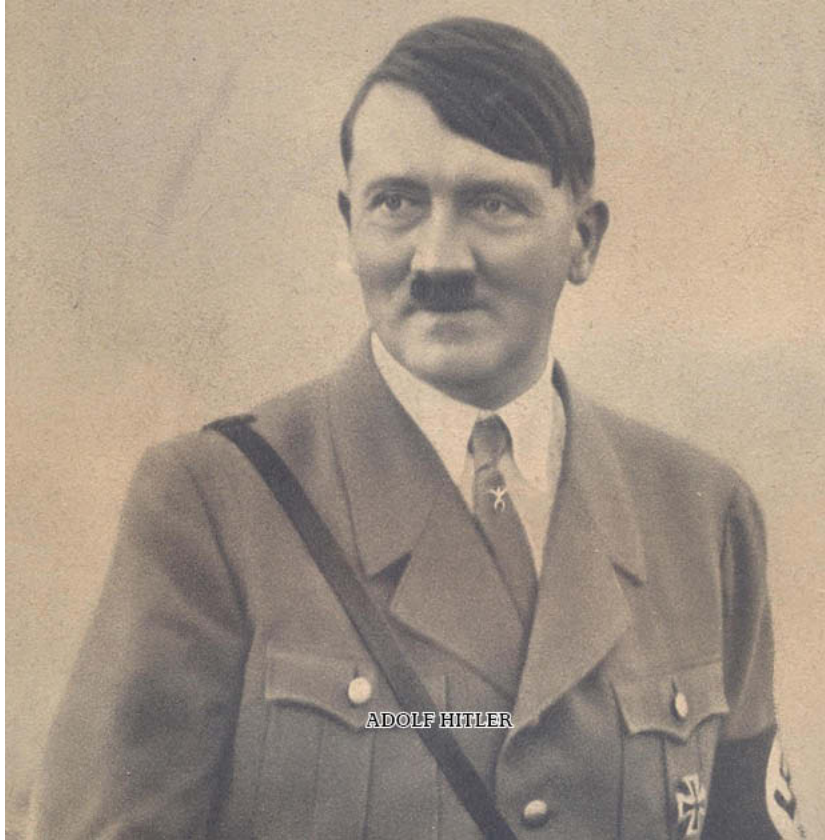
When the Age of Enlightenment began in the 17th century, there was a move towards religious tolerance of many different faiths. When Napoleon was in power, he approved laws that ended the discriminatory laws that had been placed on the Jews. However, in Europe, anti-Semitism still seemed to be based more on religious intolerance than on religious intolerance.



The history of the Holocaust is still unfolding in the 21st century. Recently, banks in Switzerland have acknowledged that they helped the Nazis against the Jews.



They are trying to make amends by establishing financial institutions that can help the victims of the Holocaust and their descendants. The money they have repaid them for the suffering they have endured.



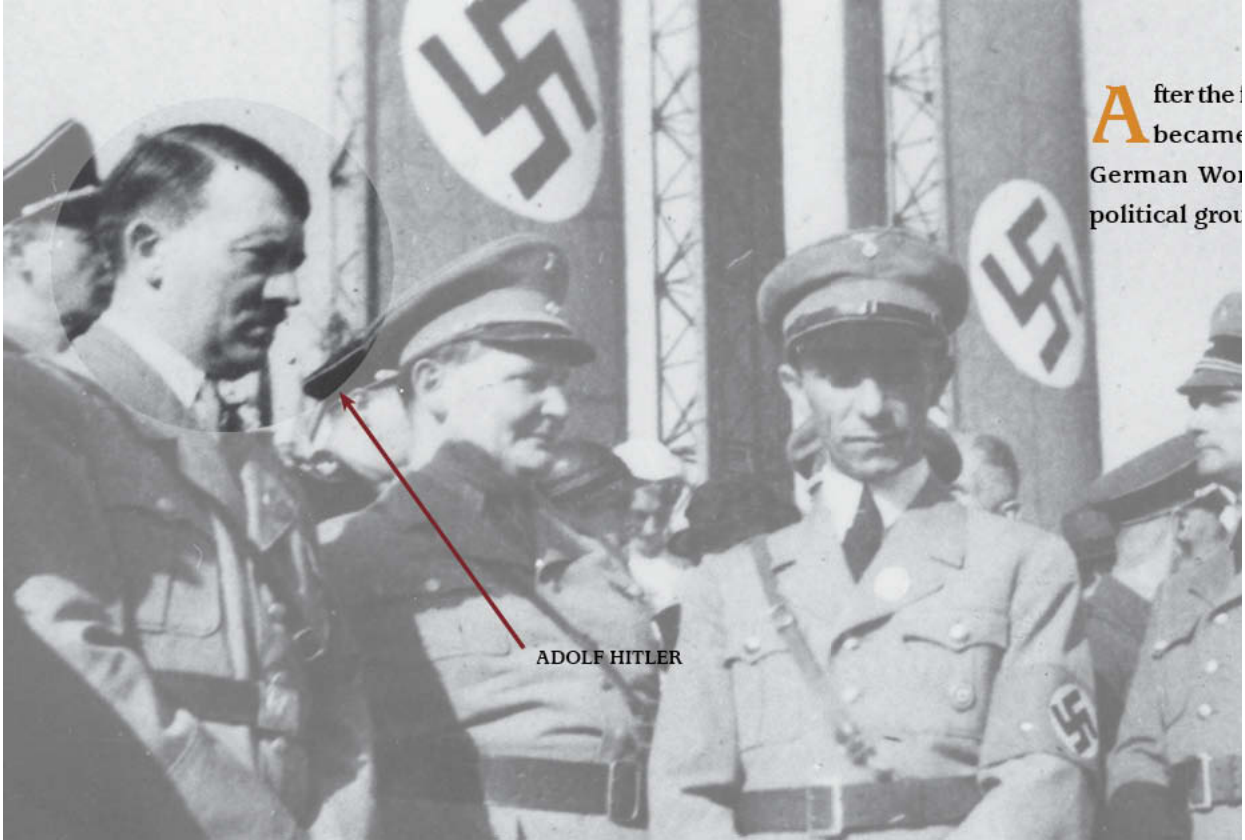
WHY THE

Adolf Hitler was born in 1889. As an adult, he was a soldier during the first World War. He developed his hatred for the Jews. At that time, many anti-Semites in the country thought the Jewish people were responsible for their country's defeat in 1918.



Hitler thought that Jewish people were less than human. He believed that the “pure race” of Germans, who were called the Aryan race, were superior to other human beings. He intended to use the principles of evolution and Darwinism to develop a race of perfect human beings based on the Aryan race.



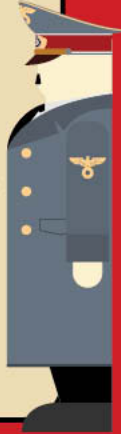

Hitler and his group tried to take over Bavaria, a section of Germany, in the incident called the Beer Hall Putsch in 1923. The attempt failed and Hitler was thrown into prison. While in prison, he wrote the now-famous book "Mein Kampf," which means "My Struggle." He made a prediction that there would be a war in Europe soon and that this war would mean "the end of the Jewish people living in Germany."

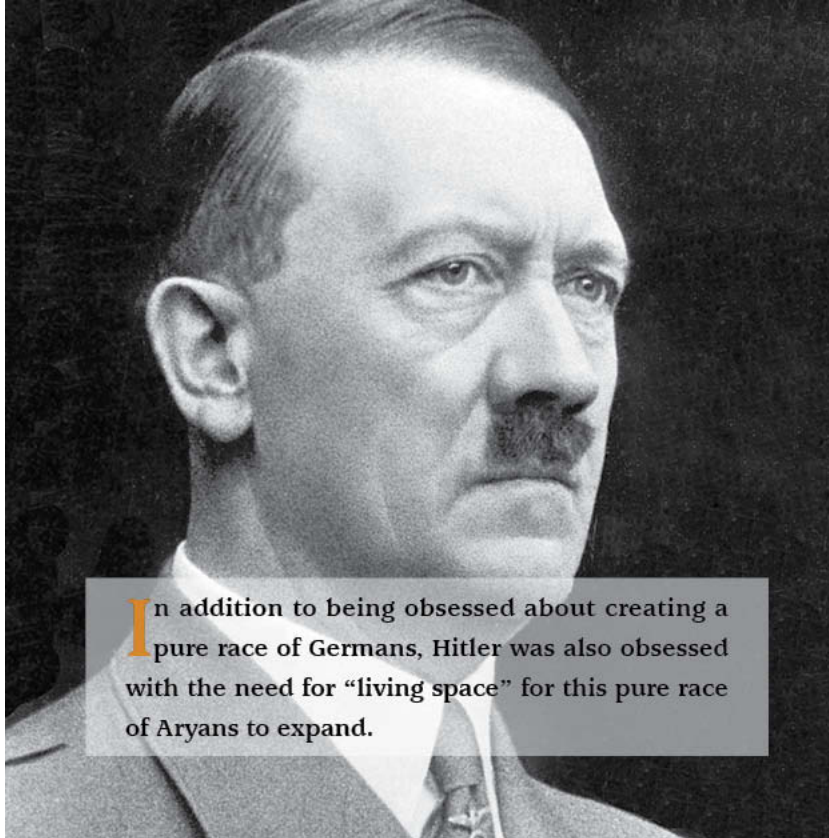

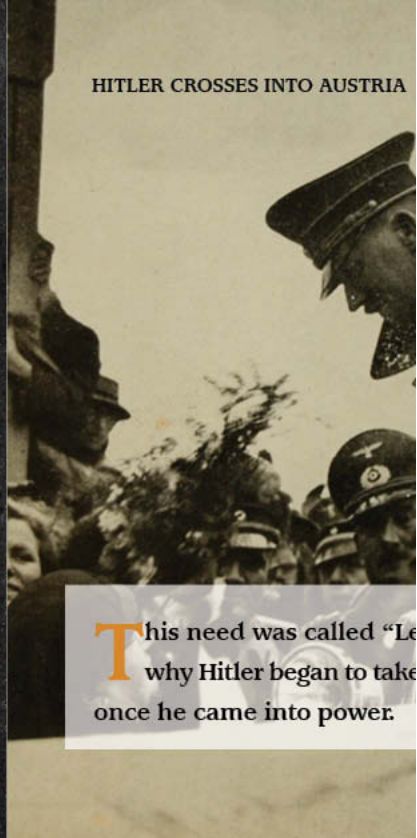

From 1933 to 1939, Hitler went forward with his evil plans. Everything he did revolved around the need for “racial purity” for the Germans and expansion so that their Aryan race could dominate the Earth.


At the beginning, they began by persecuting Communists as well as Social Democrats. Their first concentration camp was located at Dachau, near Munich, and many of the prisoners that were shipped there had Communist affiliations.

By the summer of 1933, there were over 25,000 people imprisoned in “protective custody” in the concentration camps of Germany. The Nazis began to burn books that were written by Jews or Communists in a show of their strength.

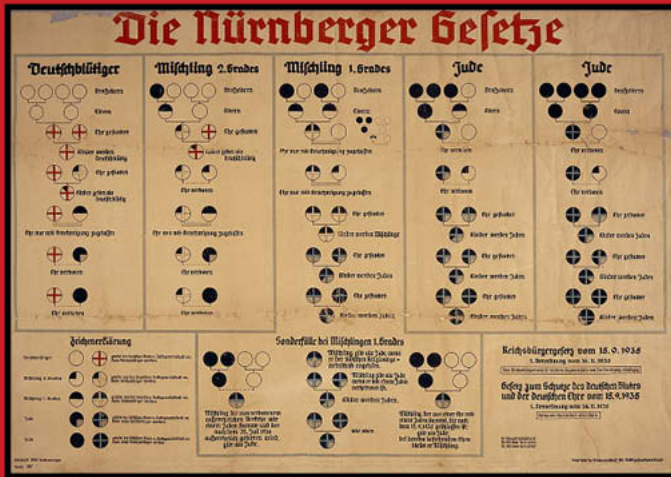

JEWS GOING TO CONCENTRATION CAMP



At that time, the number of Jews in Germany was about 1 million. Through 1939, the German government had driven non-Aryans from all civil service jobs and had liquidated Jewish-owned businesses. Jewish clients were driven away from lawyers, doctors, and other professionals. Jewish property was confiscated and Jewish-owned businesses were liquidated.



Under laws the Nazis had passed in 1935, called the **Nuremberg Laws**, people who had 3 or 4 grandparents with Jewish heritage were called half-breeds.

They became targets of violence during the riots that erupted in Kristallnacht, “the night of broken glass.”



The Nazis burned down the Jewish synagogues and smashed windows in businesses that belonged to Jews. Hundreds of Jewish people were slain and many thousands were imprisoned. Fearing that it would get worse, many Jewish people escaped from Germany. Those who stayed in the country were living in fear.

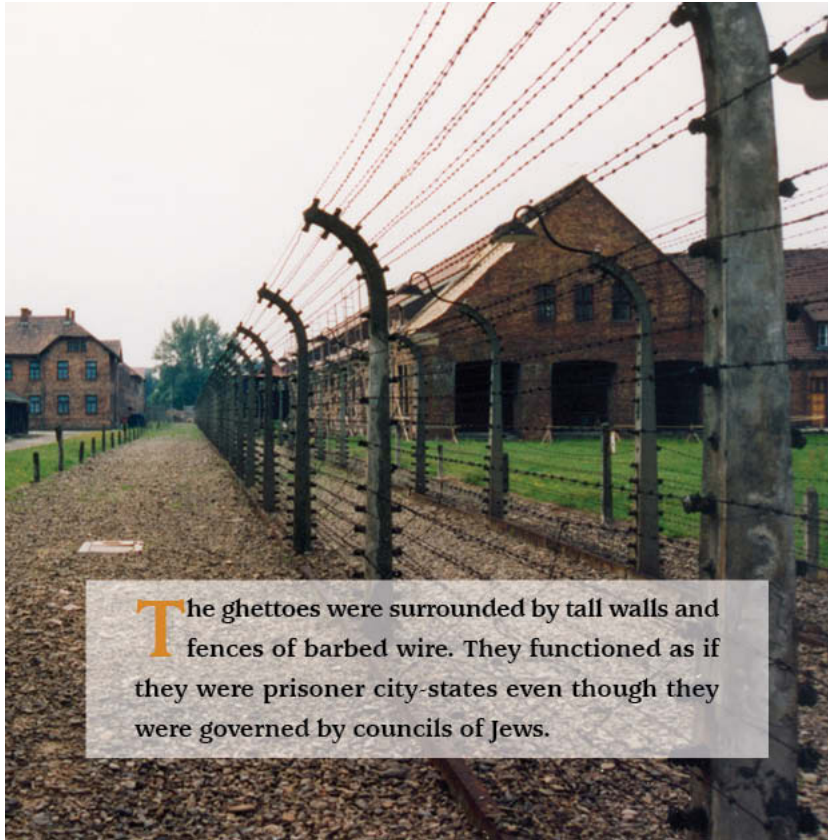


SYNAGOGUE AT NUREMBERG

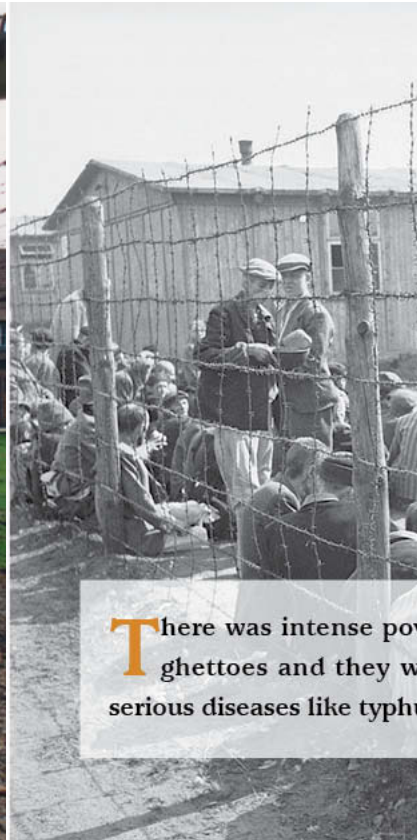


THE BEGINNING OF THE WAR

In the fall of 1939, the Nazis invaded Poland and the German government forced Jewish people to leave their homes and become prisoners in ghettos. They were taken from their lands and homes to concentration camps who identified themselves as Germans from the Nazi Party.



The ghettos were surrounded by tall walls and fences of barbed wire. They functioned as if they were prisoner city-states even though they were governed by councils of Jews.



There was intense poverty in the ghettos and they were plagued by serious diseases like typhoid.



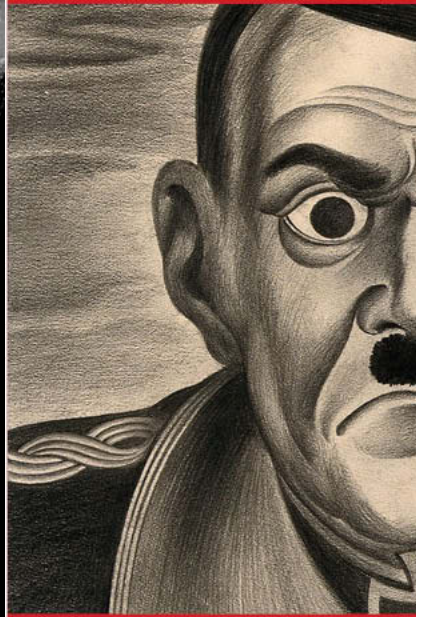
GAS CHAMBER AT AUSCHWITZ



Another part of Hitler's plan was to kill people who had genetic diseases. In 1939, over 70,000 people with mental disabilities were gassed in the Euthanasia Program. When the Allies' leaders in Germany found out about this, they and Hitler ended this program.

THE "FINAL SOLUTION," 1940 TO 1941

Hitler's soldiers marched in and conquered many of the countries of Europe to expand the Nazi Empire. Starting in 1941, Jewish people from all over the continent in addition to thousands of gypsies were shipped to the ghettos of Poland.

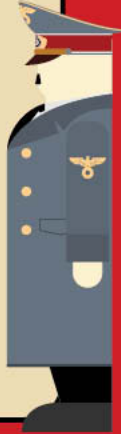


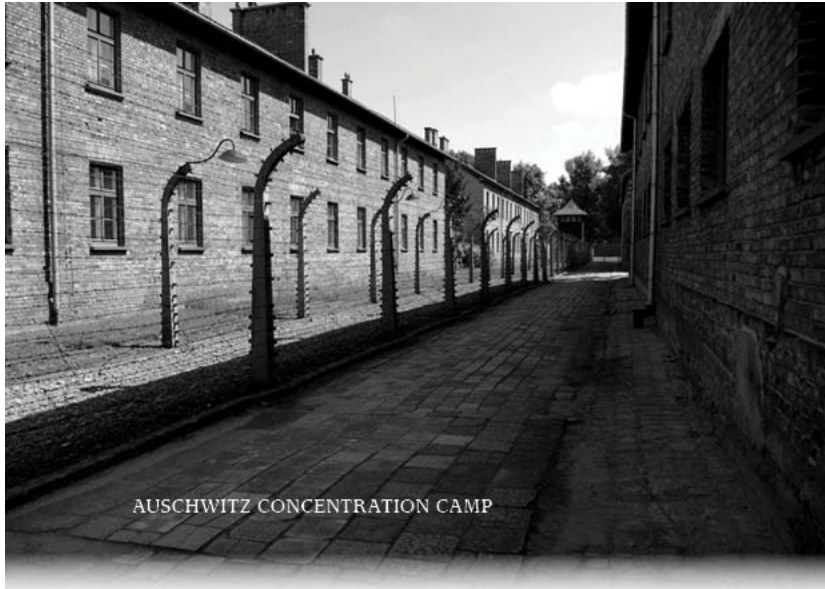

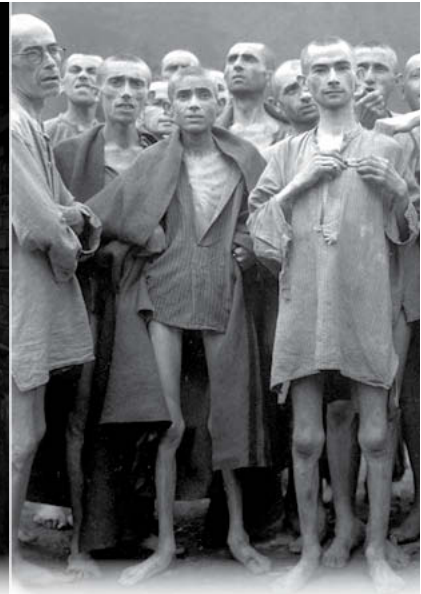
Hitler and his leaders began to discuss a “final solution” to exterminating the Jewish people. In the fall of 1941, every man, woman, and child that was a Jew in a German territory had to wear a yellow star. They were open targets for torture and murder.





AUSCHWITZ CONCENTRATION CAMP

Thousands were shipped to the ghettos in Poland as well as to the cities in the Soviet Union where the Germans had control. The Nazis had been experimenting with killing huge numbers of people at the Auschwitz concentration



camp located near Krakow. They used Zyklon B gas to kill 500 prisoners in the Soviet Union. They placed a huge pile of bodies to begin the Holocaust.



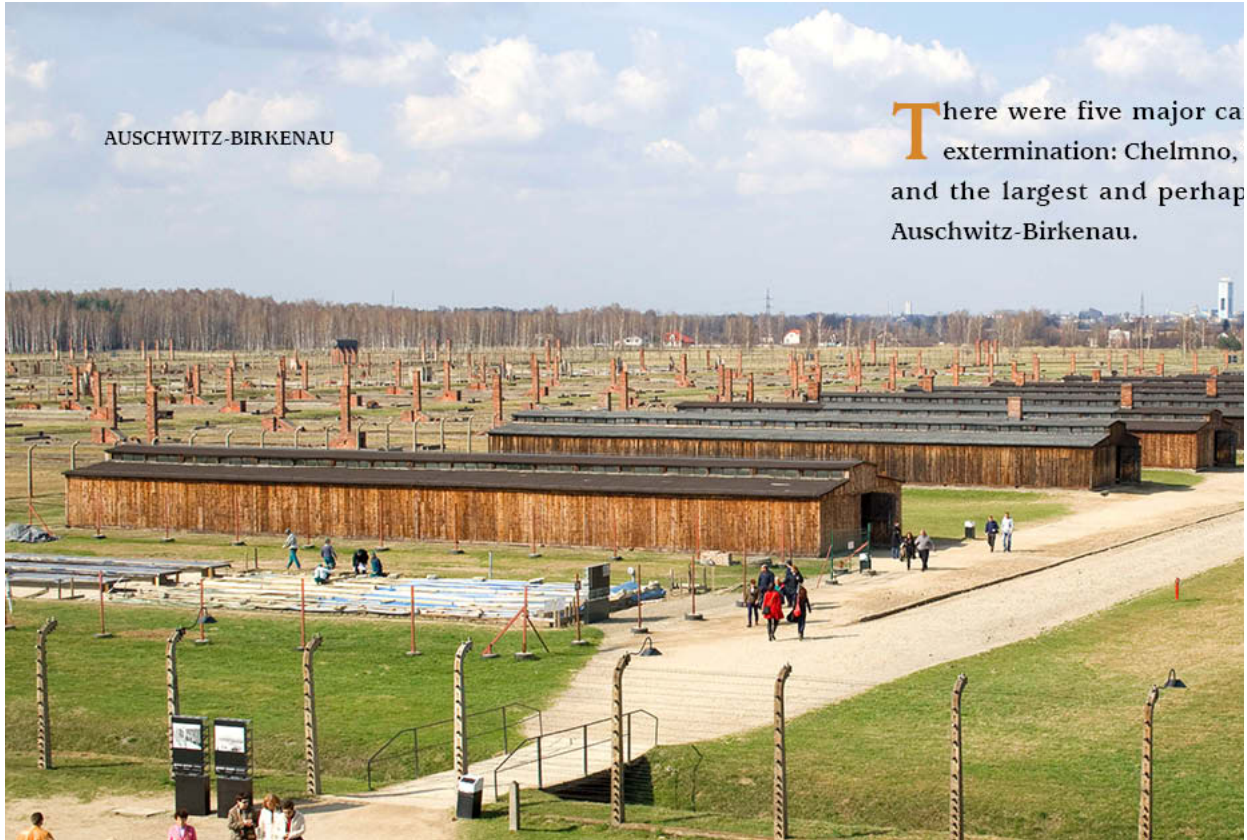
THE HOLOCAUST DEATH CAMPS, 1941 TO 1945

At the end of 1941, the Nazis began to organize mass transportation of Jewish people from Poland's ghettos to the concentration camps. They began with those they felt could not help them with manual labor. The first gassings started at Belzec in 1942. Other centers for mass killing were set up at camps that had been built in the occupied sections of Poland.

The Nazis attempted to keep their crimes secret, but the killings were so massive that it was impossible. Eyewitnesses risked their lives to ensure that the Allied Powers found out what was happening. However, for quite some time the Allied leaders didn't believe that such a large number of people could be murdered.

At the Auschwitz camp alone, over 2 million people were exterminated by gas and their bodies were burned for disposal in giant crematoriums. Thousands more died of disease or from starvation.

HITLER'S DEATH ON HEADLINES



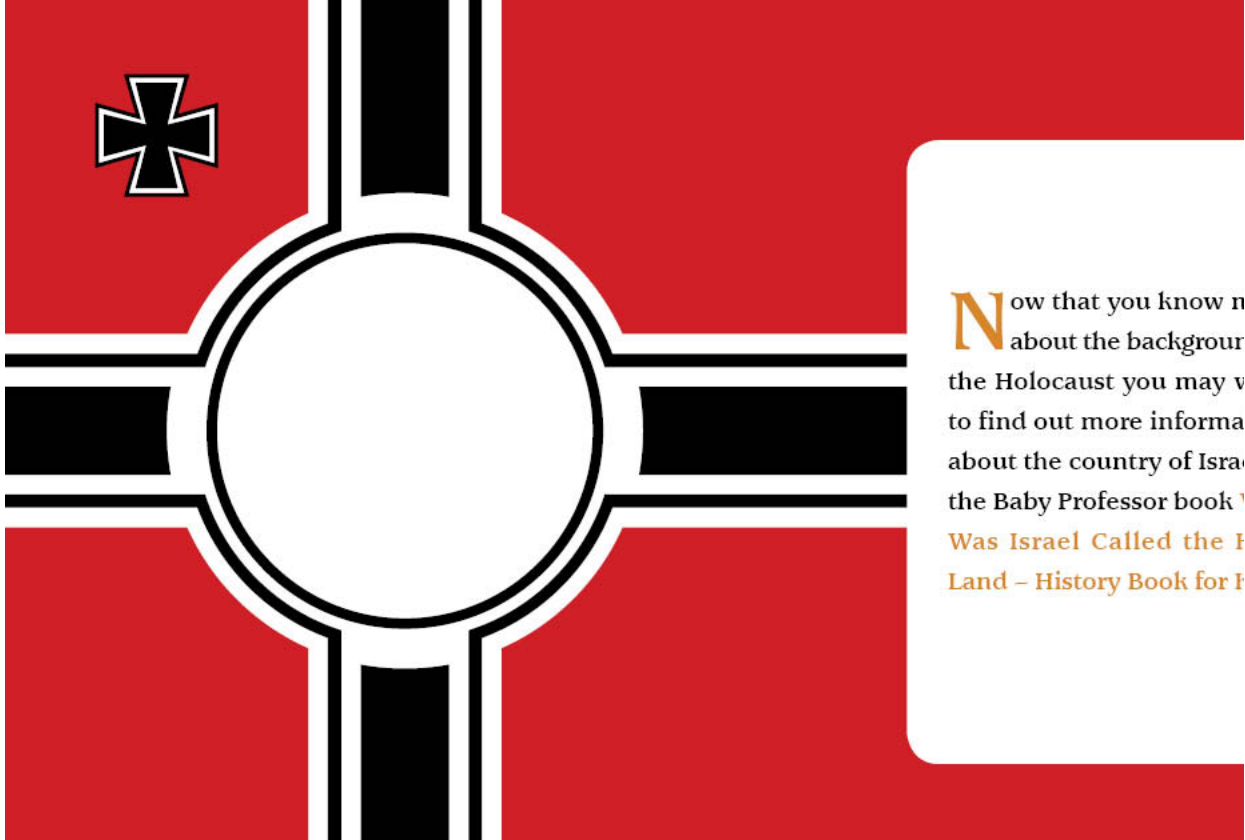
By 1945, it was clear that the Nazis were losing the war in Germany. Hitler wrote a final political statement. In the days following the outbreak of the war, he had urged the people of Germany with the "observance of duty." On April 30, 1945, he took his own life. In his final statement, he spoke of the crimes of the Nazis and the people of the world, and what had happened during the war.



SUMMARY

Hitler hated the Jewish people and considered them to be less than human. The Nazis felt that their race, the Aryan race, was superior to other races. They wanted to expand their race and exterminate the Jews. Hitler and the other members of the Nazi party killed over 6 million Jews during World War II. This horrible tragedy is called the Holocaust.
